Free Distribution Of Hand Sanitizers To Schools To Combat COVID-19.

In view of the surge in Covid-19 infections recently, K-One in early October 2020 took the initiative to give away K-One (private label) hand sanitizers to primary schools located in Ipoh. The Directors and Management of K-One believe that these young pupils are a vulnerable group and they deserve the added attention in the fight against COVID-19 infections. The hand sanitizer is an alcohol based gel generally used to kill infectious agents in the absence of normal hand wash with soap and water.

In keeping with K-One's objectives in helping the local community and supporting the education fraternity, the Management of K-One selected 3 primary schools which were located in the vicinity of its plants based in Ipoh to benefit from its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) program - provision of hand sanitizers to school children in the fight against COVID-19 infections. The 3 primary schools included:-

- Sekolah Kebangsaan Manjoi (Dua), Kampung Masjid, Ipoh
- Sekolah Jenis Kebangsaan (C) Guntong, Buntong, Ipoh
- Sekolah Jenis Kebangsaan (T) St. Philomena Convent, Jalan Silibin, Ipoh

Each of the above primary schools were given 410, 192 and 432 bottles of 60ml K-One (private label) hand sanitizers respectively. The headmistresses; namely, Pn. Farasmini, Mdm Wong and Mdm Sangari expressed gratitude on behalf of their respective schools.
