Hope Amidst the Floods

Malaysia was hit by Senyar, a tropical storm on 26 November 2025, causing overnight downpours that led to waist-level floods in several states, particularly Perak, Selangor, Negri Sembilan, Malacca and Pahang. As the water level continued to rise, many families were forced to leave their homes to seek shelter at relief centres.



On 3 December 2025, K-One's CSR team visited two Flood Relief Centres/Pusat Penempatan Sementara (PPS) in Beruas, Perak to provide aids comprising of toiletries and snacks and encouragement to families

affected by the floods. Our first stop was at Sekolah Kebangsaan Batu Hampar, where six families were temporarily seeking shelter while waiting for the waters to recede.





After that, we continued our journey to Sekolah Agama Rakyat Padang Serai, which serves as a temporary shelter to forty families. Many of them had endured hardship during the floods as most of their belongings were destroyed and their children are not able to attend school for the time being. The families may remain in the shelter until next week, when the conditions are expected to improve.



Amidst the challenges, we witnessed the resilience, positivity and the sense of close-knit community among the flood victims. They welcomed us with their smile and warmth as we paid them a visit. It cannot be underscored that despite the crisis, the spirit of unity and community bonding shine the brightest.

We are deeply grateful to Ketua Kampung Anuar, who helped and guided us throughout the visit in his community. Throughout the harsh weather, he has been working tirelessly to ensure that everyone in the kampung is safe from the floods and help from the government, NGOs, corporates and good samaritans reach those in need.



While the floods have disrupted lives, they have also reminded us of the importance of compassion, unity and lending a hand to help those in need. K-One remains committed to reach out and ensure the victims feel supported and cared for during tough times.
